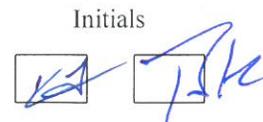

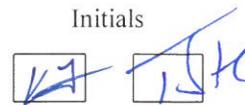
**6.2 Cat Licensing**

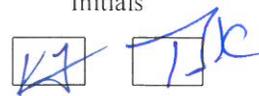

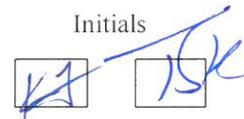

During the policy review we found that Appendix “A” for the Land Use Bylaw contains Policy F-46 the Land Use Bylaw Fee Schedule.

The Land Usage Bylaw allows for the appendices to be amended from time to time through resolution of Council. As policy F-46 is now included as a schedule in the Rates and Fees Bylaw, it is no longer required as a stand-alone policy.

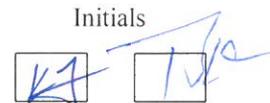

**11.1 Calgary Stampede Parade Invitation**

The Calgary Stampede Parade Committee is extending an invitation to the Town of Vulcan to once again apply to participate in the Calgary Stampede Parade.

**11.2 Town and County Airport Commission Community Airport Program Grant Host Request**

The Vulcan Flying Club and the Town of Vulcan Airport Committee have been working together to replace the runway lighting at the Vulcan airport. The Vulcan Flying Club received a grant that allowed for the purchase of lights, cables and related equipment.

The Flying Club and Airport Committee have been working with Liza Dawber researching grants that could assist with the cost to install the new lighting system. They have requested that the Town of Vulcan host a grant through the Strategic Transport Initiative Program (STIP) on their behalf.

The estimated cost for installation is \$49,000.00. Funding is currently available through the Strategic Transport Initiative Program (STIP) under the Community Airport Program (CAP). This is 75/25% matching grant applied through a municipality. The Flying Club and the Airport Committee have agreed to provide 25% matching funding needed for this project.

Moved by Councillor Paul Taylor THAT Council directs Administration to host a grant under the Community Airport Program (CAP) component of the Provincial Strategic Transport Initiative Program (STIP) on behalf of the Vulcan Flying Club and the Vulcan Town and County Airport Committee for the purpose of installing the new lighting system at the Vulcan airport.

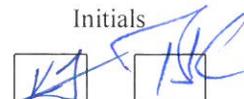
**11.4 Greatness in Leadership Conference**

**11.5 Amend Schedule “A” Bylaw No. 1457-16 2017 Rates and Fees Bylaw**

At the January 23, 2017 Regular Council Meeting of Council, a letter from the Twin Valley Regional Water Commission was received and discussed. This letter indicated an increase to the treated water rate for 2017 from \$1.71 to \$1.75 per cubic meter.

The Town of Vulcan currently charges our utility customers the same rate as what is set by the water commission. This increase in rates no longer corresponds with the treated water rates established in the 2017 Rates and Fees Bylaw Schedule “A” and requires amending. This bylaw allows for amendments to Schedule “A” by resolution from Council at any time.

Moved by Councillor John Seaman THAT Council amends the Utilities section (page 4) of Schedule “A” in the Rates and Fees Bylaw No. 1457-16 as presented to reflect the Twin Valley Regional Water Commissions change in treated water rates from \$1.71 to \$1.75 per cubic meter. **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

**11.6 Fire Protection Services Agreement**

On January 30, 2017 Town Council met with the County Council in an informal joint Council meeting to discuss moving forward with an agreement for fire protection services.

The recommendation was brought forward that a joint ad-hoc committee should be formed to assist in creating an agreement that will be acceptable to both Councils. This committee would consist of 2 County Council members, 2 Town Council members and the Town and County Administrators.

Moved by Councillor Lorna Armstrong THAT Council approves the creation of a joint ad-hoc committee with the Vulcan County for the purpose of discussing and drafting a fire protection services agreement, and appointing Mayor Tom Grant, Councillor John Seaman, and CAO Kim Fath to sit on this committee on behalf of the Town of Vulcan. **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

**11.7 Parade Float Committee Report**

Councillor Rick Howard would like to give a verbal report about the progress on rebuilding the Parade Float.

Councillor Rick Howard would also like Council to consider supporting the committee by holding an Open House for the purpose of allowing public input into the rebuilding of the Town of Vulcan parade float.

Moved by Councillor Georgia-Lee DeBolt THAT Council approves Councillor Howards request to hold an Invitation Meeting for public input on the rebuilding of the Town parade float and that the associated costs be covered by the Town of Vulcan.

**11.8 Appointment of Director of Emergency Management**

On April 25, 2016 Town Council appointed Amanda Stapleton as the Director of Emergency Management (DEM) for the Town of Vulcan as per the professional services sharing agreement with the Vulcan County.

Due to an extended absence from this position the Vulcan County is unable to continue providing this service at this time. The Town has been asked to re-appoint the DEM and Deputy DEM until such time as the County can resume providing this service.

**11.9 2016 Census Profile**

Statistics Canada has released the 2016 population census for the Town of Vulcan. The updated census shows the population for the Town of Vulcan has risen to 1,917 residents.

**11.10 Local Improvement Tax – 4<sup>th</sup> Street South from 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue**

Administration has developed a Local Improvement Plan for 4<sup>th</sup> Street South from 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue outlining the cost for paving and infrastructure improvements over a 25 year period.

Administration is requesting Council to review the Local Improvement Plans for paving and infrastructure at 4<sup>th</sup> Street South from 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue that Administration is proposing.

**10.11 Vulcan Lions Club Request**

The Vulcan Lions Club will be hosting a fundraiser in conjunction with the Canada Day celebrations for the purpose of raising funds for the swimming pool upgrades.

The Vulcan Lions Club would like to mail a letter to all local businesses in an effort to encourage support of this fund raising effort. They have requested assistance from the Town in the processing, folding, and mailing of these letters.

The Club intends on sending out approximately 65 letters. The cost to the Town to assist the Lions with this project will be nominal, approximately an hour of labor and \$70.00 in postage and supplies. As the Pool Renovation Project is a Town initiative, there is direct benefit to both organizations by working together.

Moved by Councillor Lorna Armstrong THAT Council approves the Vulcan Lions Club request to have the Town administrative staff process and mail letters on behalf of the club, for the purpose of fundraising for the Vulcan Pool. **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

**11.12 Recreation Sub Committee Funding Agreement Request**

Council approved the forming of a Recreation Sub Committee consisting of a variety of members from the community, in order to develop a plan for the needed upgrades to the Vulcan Pool.

This Committee has held several meetings including many public open house meetings to put together a new design for the pool upgrades. They have recently received cost estimates for the proposed changes to the pool. The Committee is requesting that Town Council consider entering into a funding agreement which will allow this project to move forward. A letter was supplied from the committee outlining the proposed funding model.

Moved by Councillor John Seaman THAT Council directs Administration to approach Vulcan County for the purposes of discussing and possibly drafting a funding agreement for sharing of the capital costs for the Vulcan Lions Pool upgrades.

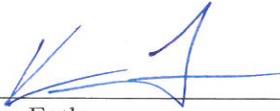
